Yumeji Takehisa — the 140th anniversary of his birth

A Taisho Roman style painter and poet, Yumeji Takehisa created his "Yumeji-style beauties" (Yumeji shiki bijin) and gain much popularity around Taisho era.

His unique works expressed the beauty in daily moments and his sympathy for people, especially women and children, and attracted the public not only at that time, but also today.

He strived to pursue his ideal beauty all through his life in the era when western and eastern cultures were mixing toward modern society.

This exhibition introduces his life as an artist from the end of Meiji to the early Showa and his 250 works including new collections and mementoes.
