

Yumeji Takehisa Love and Thoughts

-messages in his works-

Yumeji Takehisa (1884-1934), a poet and painter who represents the Taisho Romantic era, painted "Yumeji-style beauties," which were a projection of his own ideal image of women. These works gained popularity from the end of the Meiji period and had a major influence on the trends and aesthetic sense of the time.

Yumeji also had many romantic relationships throughout his life and reflected his experiences on his works. His pieces depicted emotions such as the joys of love and the sadness of separation, capturing people's hearts even in modern times.



This exhibition will introduce Yumeji's perspective, focusing on his depictions of beauty and his romance, as well as his messages to children and society.
